The Canada child benefit (CCB) is administered by the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA). It is a tax-free monthly payment made to eligible families (must reside in Canada for >18 months) to help with the cost of raising children under 18 years of age.

The goods and services tax/harmonized sales tax (GST/HST) credit is a tax-free quarterly payment for individuals and families with low/modest incomes to offset the GST or HST that they pay. Our healthcare system is separated by function. Visit a walkin-in clinic or family doctor for all nonemergencies, hospitals are for emergencies or referrals only and dental clinics offer oral health care.

Immigration Medical Exam (IME)

Newcomers should have an Immigration Medical Exam (IME) from a registered Panel Physician if they intend to remain in Canada for more than 6 months. An IME is mandatory to remove medical restrictions from this open work permit.

► Language Requirements for Permanent Residency

For Provincial and Federal pathways to Permanent Residency, applicants must provide test results from an IRCC approved agency and pay the fees. IRCC approved tests include:

CELPIP: Canadian English Language Proficiency Index Program

Must take the CELPIP-General test (not General-LS)

IELTS: International English Language Testing System

Must take the General Training Test (**not** Academic)

These tests are not available online and must be written in-person. Tests are only offered in Lethbridge, Calgary, Red Deer, Edmonton and Grand Prairie testing locations.

LINC Canadian Language Benchmark certificates are acceptable proof of English proficiency for Citizenship applications but not for Permanent Residency applications.

Permanent Residency can be gained through multiple streams; each stream has different language requirements, ranging from a minimum Canadian Language Benchmark 4 to 8.

SISA Interpretation Services

Saamis Immigration Services Association trains and offers volunteer interpretation for essential appointments. These services are available to all SISA clients and community, subject to language and volunteer availability. Priority is given to SISA clients within the first year of arrival. Form TD1, Personal Tax Credits Return, must be completed when you start a new job so that your employer can calculate the amount of income tax to deduct from your pay. See full explanation on website.

Residents (for tax purposes) in Canada pay taxes on income. Each calendar year, the amount of tax paid must be calculated and filed to the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA). Tax filing season begins in February and extends until May. Residents with a modest income will receive a portion of their taxes paid back after filing.

To receive the benefits and credits (CCB or GST/HST) CUAET visa holders may be eligible for, taxes must be filed each year, even with no income to report.
